ACADEMY AWARD Fish Bowl

Each of you writes ten words or phrases on slips of paper. You can write films, characters, actors, or anything else relating to this year's Oscars. Then, place all of the slips into a bowl. Take turns giving clues to your partner within one minute. Every answer your partner guesses correctly gives you one point. After all of the slips are gone from the bowl, add up your points. Then, return the slips to the bowl for the next round.

The game has four rounds, as follows:

- 1. Screenwriting describe the word or phrase without using the word itself, motions, "sounds like", spelling, or rhyming.
- 2. Title Sequencing give your partner a one-word clue to describe the word or phrase.
- 3. Visual Effects give your partner clues to the word or phrase using only actions.
- 4. Sound Editing give your partner clues to the word or phrase using only sounds (no words!).
